


Service Review









Senior Services:

- RVSP: Works with over 30 community partners to find volunteer opportunities for adults 55 and older looking to use their knowledge and skill to impact the community. Catholic Charities Indianapolis sponsors the RSVP Program. The Corporation for National & Community Service, a federal agency, provides major funds and administration.
- Caregiver Support: Impacted the lives of 151 caregivers through support groups, home modifications and resource assistance. Funding provided in part by CICOA Aging & in-home solutions.
- Adult Day Services: Provided safe, therapeutic and recreational day services to 65 adults with physical and/or cognitive impairments.
- Senior Companions: Provided the gift of friendship and home visits to 242 homebound clients during the year and over 1,500 hours of service a week. Catholic Charities Indianapolis sponsors the Senior Companion Program. The Corporation for National & Community Service, a federal agency, provides major funds and administration.

Family Services:

- **Counseling:** Provided over 450 individuals, families and couples with professional counseling services over the last year. Counseling expanded its services to Martinsville with the generous support of the Kendrick Foundation.
- School Social Work: Provided professional counseling services to over 2,300 school children in Indianapolis Catholic schools along with consultation services for teachers and parents.
- Neighborhood Youth Outreach: Impacted over 100 children through after school programs in the St. Joan of Arc neighborhood. This was the last year for the St. Joan of Arc Neighborhood Outreach program which ended in May 2019.

Pregnancy & Adoption Services:


• St. Elizabeth/Coleman: Provided pregnancy and adoption counseling to almost 60 women. 48 mothers and 37 children were aided by SEC support groups. 69 families were assisted by our adoption program and 60 individuals received search and reunion services. 1,200 people were educated about adoption and services that are available. Crisis Relief & Shelter Services:

- Holy Family Services: Assisted over 700 homeless adults & children with emergency shelter and transitional housing services. During a family's stay they receive resources and support to attain permanent housing and self-sufficiency. Holy Family Shelter is blessed to have had almost 1,000 volunteers last year providing over 5,500 hours of service to the shelter and its residents this year. - The Crisis Office: Helped almost 35,000 people in need of food, clothing, transportation and utility assistance. Assistance is given by linking clients with community resources and by providing direct assistance where gaps occur. Over 120 people attended the 2019 Holy Thursday Soup & Bread lunch benefitting the Crisis Office.
- The Christmas Store: Collaborated with 86 community service providers in helping over 850 families in need with clothes and gifts for Christmas. More than 200 people donated their time to assist at the Christmas store and help families in need.
- Refugee and Immigrant Services: Aided over 1,800 refugees and immigrants with services and support. Citizenship classes were offered and families were welcomed to their new home. Follow on Facebook at "Catholic Charities Indianapolis Refugee and Immigrant Services"
