

## Catholic Charities Indianapolis— Rising to the Challenge

Catholic Charities Indianapolis was founded in 1919 to serve the poor and vulnerable of central Indiana. The programs of Catholic Charities provide quality, professional services in crisis relief, shelter, pregnancy and adoption services, eldercare, counseling, and individual and family support.

In 2009-10 Catholic Charities experienced an overall 30% increase in the demand for services—including help with housing, food, and basic needs. The agency was able to rise to the challenge and meet the needs of those who came in search of help and hope. Catholic Charities Indianapolis served 42,761 men, women, and children—which represents an increase of 9,000 individuals over the prior fiscal year.

Catholic Charities aims to uphold the dignity of each person and to empower individuals and families of all faiths by offering compassionate and professional services.

## 2011 Keynote Speaker



### Louis "Lou" Holtz

One of the most well-regarded and accomplished football coaches in NCAA history, Lou Holtz was born in Follansbee, West Virginia on January 6, 1937. Holtz attended Kent State, where he played as a linebacker for two seasons before a career-ending injury. He earned a bachelor of science degree in 1959 and then went on to earn a master's degree from Iowa in 1961.

Holtz was the 27th head coach of Notre Dame following two seasons at Minnesota (1984-85), seven at Arkansas (1977-83), four at North Carolina State (1972-75), and three at William & Mary (1969-71). He spent the 1976 season as head coach of the New York Jets. He also served as head coach at the University of South Carolina for six seasons from 1999-2004.

Lou Holtz compiled a career record of 243-127-7, ranking him third in victories among active coaches and eighth in winning percentage. Holtz is the only coach in NCAA history to lead six different programs to a bowl game and the only coach to guide four different programs to the final Top 20 Poll.

Holtz was selected for the College Football Hall of Fame, Class of 2008, and The Walter Camp Football Foundation named Lou Holtz 1998's Man of the Year.

Holtz was a sports analyst on CBS and currently serves as a college football studio analyst on ESPN.

Holtz also is an author of three *New York Times* best-selling books.

For many years Lou Holtz has been considered among the greatest speaking legends in America today. He speaks on overcoming seemingly impossible challenges by setting your own goals and working to achieve them.

Married to Beth Barcus of East Liverpool, Ohio on July 22, 1961, Holtz and Beth are the parents of four children, grandparents of nine grandchildren, and currently reside in Orlando, Florida. Lou and Beth's daughter, Liz, resides in Brownsburg with her husband, Mike, and their three children Zachary, Beth and Jacob, and are members of St. Malachy Parish.
