Historic meeting enlarges Rome, Canterbury dialog

VATICAN CITY - In an atmosphere carefully com-pounded of friendliness and formality a pope and an Anglican archbishop of Canterbury met officially for the first time since the Reformation.

Archbishop Michael Ramsey, spiritual leader of the world-vide Anglican Communion of 17 wide Anglican Communion of 17 independent churches and 45 million members, arrived at Rome's Flumicino a irport (March 22) for his historic three-day visit.

The overworked word "historic" rings clear and strong in this case for several reasons. The previous visit of the then archbishop of Canterbury, Dr. Geoffrey Fisher, to Pope John XXIII, symbolized a new era of good feelings, but was strictly personal and unofficial.

What about China?

A little knowledge is a dangerous thing. It can make you an "expert." Then, before you know it, Congress is summoning you to testify on something or other.

We don't mean to belittle the stature of witnesses who have appeared before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee to tell what they know about Communist China. But it is becoming obvious that it doesn't take much knowledge to make one an expert in this particular field.

The committee's wide-ranging study of Sino-Ameri-ican relations has been focusing on the decision of 1950 which so effectively isolated the United States from any direct communications with mainland China.

It is one of today's unhappy ironies that we have more specific knowledge about some areas of outer space than we have about many areas of Chinese life.

This accounts for much of the guessing and conflicting opinions that have been flying around Capitol Hill ever since the Senate committee decided to start asking questions about present Vietnam policies.

For, the fact is, no single aspect of the Vietnam conflict can be isolated from Red China. China is the single most important problem and perplexing riddle for American foreign policy in the 20th century.

An intelligent foreign policy in one atom century.

An intelligent foreign policy is one that is both morally right and in the best interests of the country. But such a policy cannot possibly be formulated without taking into fullest account the existence of an unfriendly nation with one-fourth of the world's population. Further, such a nation must be evaluated as accurately as possible, leaving out all emotionalism and wishful thinking.

John Hay was not the greatest Secretary of State we ever had, but he was a superb realist and an expert on turn-of-the-century China. Looking beyond his own life span, he predicted in 1900 that "he who understands China has the key to politics (world affairs) for the next 500 years."

Hay's vision is beginning to be dimly seen by others today. Thanks to the good work of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, earnest men who differ strongly on aspects of the Vietnam war are beginning to discuss the prospects of a change of policy on Red China from "isolation" to one of strong military "containment," just as Russia and its satellites are "contained" in Eastern Europe.

Eastern Europe.

Vice-President Humphrey has advanced some cautious comments to that general effect. Several leading church groups, helding prominent Catholic churchmen, have in the past week urged a variety of way of trong to enclose contacts with Red China. Some have contacted with Red China Some have contacted with Red China Admission to the United Nations. President chinase has relaxed travel bans. None of this meets that Red China has become a "good guy" in some eyes, just that it exists, and must be reckoned with.

The problem of achieving some sort of meaningful diague with China is, of course, not one-sided. Peking has placed impossible demands on UN membership. It shows no inclination toward diplomatic reciprocity. Its official policy remains one of hatred of the U.S.

Hopefully, however, the open-minded climate that has developed from the Senate hearings may result in at least some sort of change in the dangerous head-in-the-sand relationship between the U.S. and Communist China. Any effort-short of appeasement is better than a head-on war.
