Now as Fatima celebrates 60 years of "practicing the art of spiritual renewal" so much has changed. Our programming used to be very focused on one style of retreat offered most every weekend throughout the year. Now there are a variety of retreat offerings serving people in many different life situations. We offer special retreats for the engaged, the married, the divorced, the grieving, those in recovery, student leaders, high school seniors, people seeking silence and those enhancing their experience of Lent. We offer mornings for moms, days of silence, days and evenings of recollections and date nights.

But we realize, too, that much has changed in society and in our communities. People's lives are busier than they were sixty years ago. And people have so many more choices for their leisure time. Some have a "getaway place" of their own;

HAPPENINGS AT OUR LADY OF FATIMA

Strategic Planning

Recently several of the staff and board members participated in a strategic planning process that was facilitated by Bob Bailey from the Service Corps of Retired Executives. Bob Miramonti and John Post from SCORE also assisted in the planning sessions. The process was very helpful in highlighting our strengths and in bringing about some consensus about actions we need to take to continue to broaden the ministry of Fatima and increase the support we enjoy from the larger community. Thanks to the SCORE representatives for the generous donation of their time and talent.

HVAC Replacement

Greg Schaub -former board member and owner of EM Co Inc. is working diligently with Eric Atkins of the Archdiocese and others working on a plan to replace all pipes for the heating and cooling system as well as the domestic water service. The total cost of the project is over \$400,000. \$250,000 towards the project is coming from money designated for Fatima from from the Archdiocesean Legacy for Our Misison Campaign. Their contribution will cover the cost of the pipes and a new boiler. Still left to do is a new chiller and controls for the system. Contributions are still being sought for this important project.

The new system will reduce energy costs and save us a great deal on what we have been paying for repairs each year.

Annual Fund

Thank you to the more than two hundred Fatima supporters who have responded positively to our request for a financial contribution to help us to close the gap between our income and expenses. Your generous response raised \$24,000 and donations are still coming in. Thank you!


