

INTRODUCTION

about the novena

The Archdiocese of Indianapolis will soon take up the national collection for the <u>Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD)</u>. In the United States, more than 38 million people live in poverty. Through your prayers and financial support, those living in poverty are empowered to transform the places they live into reflections of the Kingdom of God. In addition to making an impact nationally, those living in poverty in our own diocese are empowered through the 25% share of our collection that stays here. Through this novena, we ask that you prayerfully consider how you are able to help CCHD this year.

This year, we hold in prayer three of our recent local CCHD grantees in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis: the Men's Warming Center of Bedford, Teen Mother Choices, and DatHouse Inc.'s DatKids program.

The Men's Warming Center in Bedford provides shelter, sleeping accommodations, food, clothing, showering facilities, and access to laundry equipment for men experiencing homelessness. The Center was established in 2014 after a homeless man froze to death on a street in Bedford, IN. Following this tragedy, the late

Fr. Rick Eldred, then Pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church, worked closely with a coalition of other Lawrence County churches and city and county governmental officials to establish a low-barrier shelter for homeless men during the harsh winter months. In addition to basic services, staff assist these

low- income men in obtaining necessary identification documents, searching for employment, budgeting skills to help break the cycle of poverty, seeking mental health or addiction counseling, accessing needed medical or dental care, and aiding in pursuing a reconnection with family members if they so desire to strengthen their family structure.


Teen Mother Choices is a two-year program which began in 2007 to serve teen mothers

(ages 13-23) who have already given birth and are now parenting. These young women are taught life skills, financial management, and budgeting skills to enable them to break the cycle of poverty and are provided with a mentor to accompany them as they learn parenting skills as well as take courses in healthy relationships. The program was started thanks to a cooperative effort between Lyn Weidner and the Most Rev. Shaun Danda, then pastor of St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Church, Brookville, and St. Peter's Catholic Church

<u>Dathouse Inc.</u> is a faith based not-for-profit which exists to be a leader and catalyst in fostering a healthy mixed income community. Dathouse Inc. aspires to be good neighbors, invest in young people, and encourage Christian Community Development. Dathouse Inc. received a CCHD local grant specifically for DAT Kids after-school program. The mission of the program is to create a safe space in the neighborhood to empower and equip at-risk youth with practical life, social, and emotional skills in an effort to foster relationships that build the next generation of community members.

This novena to Our Lady for Justice focuses on a different title of Mary from the Litany of Loreto for each of the 9 days, combined with a prayer intention for these three organizations which receive funding from the local CCHD grant. It incorporates the Prayer to Our Lady of Guadalupe for Justice from the USCCB, and closes with an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be.
