RE: 2017 - 2018 ACRE Report

Each year during the month of January, every Parish and Catholic school is asked to formally assess their catechetical efforts through the use of the *NCEA IFG: ACRE* instrument (ACRE). Your participation provides valuable information that guides Archdiocesan, Parish, and School planning for future catechetical efforts. The data on the following pages comes from the Archdiocesan ACRE report and is available to catechetical leaders as a reference to aid in their task of interpreting their local ACRE report.

Catechetical leaders, please be aware...

- Individual Student Reports should be sent home to parents as primary educators of their children.
- ACRE data is provided in the same format as standardized scores and should not be compared to a typical grading scale where 95% = A, 86% = B etc.
- Data should be read while keeping in mind the hours available for catechetical instruction. This is typically 30+ hours for a Parish and 60+ hours for a School.
