





Becky's Place Success Story

Ashley* had been to Becky's Place twice, but this time was different. She struggled with addiction for most of her adult life but refused to seek treatment in the past. At the time, she was asking the court for her children back and feared a stay in rehab would end this process.

Becky's Place staff was surprised when Ashley expressed her desire to attend rehab and receive extra help to prevent a relapse. Her case manager immediately set up a 30-day stay in a local facility to address her addiction and mental health. Ashley completed the inpatient rehab and was so excited, motivated and full of hope for the future when she returned to Becky's Place.

Ashley got a job at a local factory and saved her money. She began addressing her physical health issues, attending self-help meetings and becoming a model resident. She petitioned the court and was honest about attending rehab and her progress. Ashley was allowed more time with her children and unsupervised visitation. She was ecstatic to see her children more often.

Her mission to find appropriate housing for her family continued, and she eventually found "the perfect apartment." Three of her neighbors are aftercare residents of Becky's Place, and they help and support each other. Ashley was recently awarded additional time with her children and occasionally gets to pick her kids up from school. She is proud of her journey and accomplishments and is grateful for the Becky's Place community.

Becky's Place Review

Becky's Place provides shelter services for women and children in Bedford and the surrounding communities. The shelter averages 23 residents each night. Becky's Place also serves as an unofficial call center for our community, answering 2-3 calls every day from women - and men - seeking resources for a myriad of challenges.

The majority of women at the shelter are dealing with one or more physical or mental health conditions and have no income. Over 50% have experienced some sort of domestic violence. The staff works with them to complete the shelter program, move into permanent housing and participate in an aftercare program. Residents who do not complete the program are connected with options for temporary housing.

Becky's Place is grateful to receive support from Bedford and surrounding communities. Various organizations donated materials, time and resources to support Becky's Place and granted over \$243,000 in funds.
