RESIDENT SHARES HOW BECKY'S PLACE HELPED HER MAKE A FRESH START

Chelsea came to Becky's Place fleeing from a domestic violence situation. She didn't have any family or friends to stay with and needed a safe place to go. We were also able to place her in a family room and her precious baby girl came to live with us as well.

Chelsea hit the ground running. She worked the program and was extremely motivated and completed every goal given to her.



She engaged in parenting classes, attended therapy, and improved her communication, coping, and self-advocacy skills. She continued to work on her sobriety and was a wonderful example for the other ladies in the house. She was able to take time to take care of herself and obtain medical and dental care she had been putting off. Chelsea worked two jobs and both employers praised her hard work and dedication. She was always smiling, and all the staff and residents adored her sweet family.

Chelsea was able to secure a rental house and recently moved out of the shelter. Since then, she was able to gain custody of her son and is looking forward to continuing to move forward with her life. Chelsea is enrolled in our aftercare program and continues to engage in case management services. She shares this about her experience at Becky's place.

"My time at Becky's Place has been truly amazing. It was rough adjusting to everything at first, but the staff and other residents were amazing from the start. They are always there to encourage and cheer you on. They welcomed me and my children with open arms. To see such kindness from people who don't even know you is just absolutely astonishing. They have helped me in so many ways. They have fought for and with me every step of the way. I honestly don't know if I could have made it to where I am today without them. They have helped build my confidence in myself, taught me how to be more independent and to never take less than what I deserve.

I've grown tremendously since being at Becky's Place. I honestly couldn't have asked for better people and a place to help me and my children have a fresh start. They will always be in my heart."

RESIDENT UPDATE

We currently have 10 women and 10 children we are serving. 5 women are employed, 2 receive disability benefits, and the other 3 are job searching. We have 3 women who are ready to move out and actively searching for a safe home. One resident has obtained a car and is now able to reunite with her family in another state. <u>Becky's Place continues to serve as an unofficial call center for our community, answering 2-3 calls every day from women-and men-seeking resources for a myriad of challenges.</u>

RUN FOR HOPE 5K ANOTHER GREAT SUCCESS

The 2023 Becky's Place Run for Hope 5K was another great success. Over 130 people participated in the Thanksgiving morning run.

We are so grateful to all who supported and participated in this event. You raised nearly \$20,000 to support homeless women and children in our community. We hope you will join us for the 2024 run on November 28.

SUMMER COOKING PROGRAM HELPS RESIDENTS LEARN LIFE SKILLS

Becky's Place hosted "Cooking with JJ" during the 2023 summer. This program was provided by Purdue Extension Nutrition Education Program. J.J. Goldsberry came to the shelter weekly to teach residents about nutrition and preparing food that is both healthy and quick to prepare. Residents also learned a lot of practical information like planning menus, using what is in our cupboards, and how coupons can help save money. These are all important life lessons that residents can use after they leave Becky's Place.
