Dear Friends of Becky's Place,

"For this is the message you have heard from beginning: we should love one another. The way we came to know love was that he laid down his life for us; so we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. If someone who has worldly means sees a brother in need and refuses him compassion, how can the love of God remain in him? Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." (1 John 3:11,16-18)

The First Letter of St. John offers a perfect frame for our spring newsletter. As we continue to highlight our service to the community, we are reminded that our work is, and has always been, about love. The inseparable love of neighbor and the love of God guide our support for those we encounter at the margins. As we celebrate this milestone, we are also reminded of Jesus' words from John's gospel: "You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me." (John 12:8)

Jesus did not promise that care for our poor would be easy. On the contrary, He tells us that it will be mankind's most challenging and important work. In order to endure, that work must be grounded in something that is fundamentally bigger, stronger and deeper: that inseparable love of God and love of neighbor. For 11 years, Becky's Place has been a ministry of love, not just in word, but in action. Nowhere is that more evident than in our dedicated staff and volunteers. Our volunteers and staff give unconditionally to the homeless women and children we serve. Their work with Becky's Place has helped build upon that legacy of love for the least of our brothers and sisters.

If you are reading this newsletter, chances are that you are a part of the Becky's Place legacy as well. Your gift of volunteering, financial investment, and prayer has ensured that Christ's wish for mankind to look out for our poor continues to be fulfilled. Susan* came to Becky's Place in August of 2022. She was fleeing domestic violence. She came to Indiana to stay with a friend and could only stay for a short time. When she arrived at Becky's Place, she had a hard time maintaining eye contact and often looked at the ground. She had little to no confidence in her abilities and said "I'm sorry" frequently. Staff reassured her as much as possible that she was worthy of care and respect.

Susan found a job and started to work in home health care. She was saving her money and working on goals like fixing her car, addressing trauma, paying off debts, learning boundaries, and filing for a divorce. Susan was dedicated to healing and took all advice from professionals on how to cope with her past.

Susan dove headfirst into not only healing, but growing. She decided that her health care job was not where she wanted to land long-term. She applied for another position with higher pay and secured the job. She addressed her mental and physical well-being. She was accepted into higher education for phlebotomy classes. Lastly, she became a confident person and felt proud of her accomplishments.

Susan found housing nearby and is adjusting well. She has already been back to Becky's Place to volunteer her time. She often tells staff that she couldn't have completed these goals without their support. Staff remind her that she did the work to complete these goals and that we were just her cheerleaders.

We are currently serving 14 residents and three children. Becky's Place continues to serve as an unofficial call center for our community, answering 2-3 calls every day from women-and men-seeking resources for a myriad of challenges. Twelve residents are employed and the other two are working with their case managers to find employment. Becky's Place had two families recently move into permanent housing and we are excited for their futures.








SHELTERBRATION IS A SUCCESS

Stephane provided all the supplies including storage totes. She said "it was her way to give back and serve Christ." Stephanie worked for 4 months to complete this project.

Today the job is done, and the space does not look the same. When asked what she liked most about her work she said, "Now people can actually come down here and get what they need." We are grateful to Stephane and all of our volunteers that help us to provide help and create hope for homeless women and children.

Thanksgiving Day Thursday, November 23, 2023 Downtown Bedford - The Depot Starting at 9:00am




