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

INDIVIDUAL & FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES

Individual, Couple and Family Counseling: (317) 236-1500, Option 2 - Professional counseling is available on a sliding fee scale, based on income.

School Social Work: Phone (317) 236-1523 - Professional counseling services are provided for school children along with consultation services for teachers and parents.

SJA – **Neighborhood Youth Outreach Program (NYO)**: (317) 283-1518 - Activities such as after school and summer programs serve urban youth and their families in the St. Joan of Arc neighborhood.

ELDERCARE SERVICES

Adult Day Services, A Caring Place – (Northside): (317) 466-0015 - Therapeutic, safe day care is available for senior adults, over 50 years old, with cognitive and physical impairments.

Caregiver Support: (317) 261-3378 - Monthly caregiver support groups, identification of community resources, and small scale home modifications are available for family/friends caring for adults age 60+.

Senior Companion Program: (317) 236-1565 - Recruits adults 55+ to assist homebound frail adults. Accepts referrals for older adults needing help with everyday tasks and families in need of respite care.

RSVP: (317) 261-3378 - RSVP is a clearinghouse of volunteer opportunities for adults 55 and over. Partnerships with community nonprofits and public agencies offer opportunities for volunteers to meet significant community needs. Volunteers maintain the flexibility to decide which organizations to serve and how frequently.



CRISIS RELIEF, REFUGEE AND IMMIGRATION SERVICES

Crisis Office: (317) 236-1512 - Food, clothing, limited transportation, rent and utilities money are available for those in emergency/critical need.

Refugee and Immigration Services: (317) 236-1518 - Advocacy, family reunification, job assistance, help in setting up households are services available for refugees. Naturalization, family petitions and deferred action are available for immigrants.

The Christmas Store: (317) 236-1512 - Christmas gift assistance is available for needy families referred by caseworkers.

HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS SERVICES

Holy Family Shelter: (317) 635-7830 - Temporary shelter, meals, counseling, child care and job assistance are offered to homeless families.

Holy Family Transitional Housing: (317) 636-5534 - Extended services for families facing chronic homelessness are provided.

ADOPTION & PREGNANCY SERVICES

St.Elizabeth|Coleman Pregnancy & Adoption Services: (317) 787-3412 - Full-service birthparent and adoptive parent preparation and support for domestic, transracial, medical needs and international adoptions.
