Historic encounter first in 500 years

VATICAN CITY—I. Osservatore Romano, Vatican City daily, printed on its front page (Dec. 18) a story from Damascus, Syria, stating that Orthodox Patriarch Athenagoras of Constantinople would meet Pope Paul VI during his January 4 to 6 visit to the Holy Land.

The Damascus story was based on an aunouncement by Patriarch Theodossius VI of the Eastern Orthodox Church of Antioch and the Entire East. The meeting would be the first encounter between a Roman pontiff and the spiritual leader of Orthodoxy in more than five centuries. The Damascus dispatch said the meeting was expected to take place in Jerusalum.

Printing of the story in the Vatican City daily was considered here as tantamount to Vatican confirmation of the report. It is believed extremely unlikely that such a story would be carried by the paper without the approval of the Vatican Secretariat of State.

(At the same time a report from Athens stated that the ruling body of the Orthodox Church of Greece went on recruning body of the O'Holodox Church of Greece went on rec-ord as opposing a trip by Pst'sizeré Athenagoras to meet with Pope Paul in the Holy Land. It was reported that the Holy Synod of the Greek O'thodox Church decided that such a trip by Patriarch Athenagoras "would bear no fruit." The O'thodox primate of Greece, Archbishop Chrysostomos, was reported as being strongly opposed to the encounter.)



S WE approach again that moment of Good News for all human history, our thoughts turn this year especially to the meaning of Christmas for our own land.

We ask that every American—having witnessed grand tragedy and the horrors of racial hatred—might find the inspiration to develop a sense of Christian effizienship in his political and social responsibility, in his dialogue with op-position, and in his brotherhood with men of unlike color and creed.



In such cases principles must be studied carefully, and the act seen in all its circumstances—and even its concentration.



Rise of violence in Latin America

OME—For four years venezuela
has had a president honestly and
democratically elected as Latin
American president so, extremely
popular as Latin American presidents go, promoting social and economic reform at a pace rare in
Latin America. Yet during all this
presidency, and with constantly increasing impact and impetus, the
regime has been shaken by violence and terror. For a change,
the threat is not from the conservative side but
from the very elements who preclaim themselves
the prophets and apostles of social justices

Quite apart from formal evidence or the reports
of commissions of investigation, it is reasonable
to assume that Castar has played a part in the
program to prevent Venezuela's evolution towards
a more just and democrate order. He is bound

himself to premote Cuban-type revolution wherever
he can in Lath America, to fight reform that would
make his solution superfluous.

It is noteworthy that a major extension of the terrorist factics into neighboring Colombia occurred recently at the precise moment when the intercently at the precise moment when the intercently at the precise moment when the intercent American war games known as Operation American were taking place in the Carbibean, an exercise do nounced by the Castroites as an invasion of Latin America, Some twenty bombs, were exploded intaneously in Bogota, Cali and Baranquilla to domentate that sealing of the approaches is no remedy for internal dissatisfaction.

It is perhaps not less simificant that simultaneously in Brazil a plot was amounced to kill President Goulart, a plot attributed not to Castroites but to the extreme righ wine. And all of this in the same month in which the United States endured the shame of a presidential assistantion which may not have been inspired by either left or right, but which was in the tradition of lawiesaness from which the entire continent suffers.

In a quite different context, Bishop Marco McGrath of Panama recently put his finger on what I think is the basic cause of the violence which increasing numbers of Latin Americans seem to regard as the only way to resolve their problems.

"The crisis of Latin America," he told me, "is a diminishing confidence in the total order. The intellectual structure is being challenged especially in the universities, where professors and students share a deep distrist of everything related to the traditional society of the region. Their views radiate outward into professional and political life, and downwards through all social strata,"

downwards through all social strats."

What strengthers this interpretation is that the violence in Venezuela finds not only its leadership but its activities precisely among university students and intellectuals. It is not a spontaneous and futile protest against intolerable personal living conditions, like much of Colomba's banditry and the sporadic Indian outbreaks in Peru, In consequence, while every effort must continue to remove the causes for mass dissattsfaction by land reform and other techniques to lift the hordes of the starving to a himman level of living, more though must be given to re-christianizing intellectual life, to restoring moral confidence.

As urgent as it is difficult is the task of persuad-ing Latin Americans that the United States is not merely seeking to perpetual its privileged eco-nomic position when it backs regimes like the pre-ent one in Venezuela. Here we have a traige his-lory of failure to live down. For over a generation, Venezuela's oil production has caulated that of Task, yet has brought no similar benefits to the producing country.

The constant quibbling and horsetrading in Congress over foreign aid is one of the most public of the signs which Latin Americans interpret as meaning that the future will be like the past. Nor can we blame our lawmakers exclusively, for they reflect the views of their constituents. If, therefore, we want to end vulence in Venezuela, we must begin by teaching the United States voter his duty to his fellow men and to himself.






