## **Find Emergency Meals for Kids and Teens**

USDA Food and Nutrition Service has begun granting waivers that allow states approved for non-congregate feeding, greater flexiblities which allow parents and/or guardians to pick up meals for their children, without the student

needing to be present. This waiver is effective immediately, and remains in effect through June 30, 2020, or until expiration of the federally declared public health emergency, whichever is earlier. Click here for more information.

Parents with kids and teens 18 years old and under can use our <u>Meals 4 Kids</u> mapping tool to find sites near them where they can pick up free nutritious meals and snacks. 

Ideas for Virtual & Distancing Volunteering:

- Donating and/or starting vegetable and flower seeds for community gardens

## TAKE ACTION NOW!! URGE ADMINISTRATION TO ENSURE AN ETHICAL COVID-19 VACCINE!!

There is absolutely no reason why a vaccine for COVID-19 should be connected to abortion. But that is exactly what may happen in the coming months.

Among the dozens of vaccines currently in development, some are being produced using old cell lines that were created from the cells of aborted babies.

There is NO NEED to further exploit the bodies of aborted children.

Other cell lines or processes that do not involve cells from abortions are available!

In fact, they are regularly used for producing vaccines and are being used by some drug companies to develop a COVID-19 vaccine.

### **Background**

The coalition letter expresses strong support for efforts to develop an effective, safe, and widely available vaccine as quickly as possible, but also strongly urges the federal government to "ensure that fundamental moral principles are followed in the development of such vaccines, most importantly, the principle that human life is sacred and should never be exploited."
